You can become a certified Teacher-Trainer in a World Religion

Many different religions on the rise in the U.S. are outgrowing Christianity. Muslims, Mormons, and Jehovah's Witnesses are missionaries to Christians. We are living in an unprecedented time of religious pluralism.

You can learn to teach and train your church to understand your religious neighbors and to share your faith with them.

The World Religions and Global Cultures Center of Campbell University Divinity School enables you to teach about a particular religion or cultural group to churches and other groups. In order to earn a certificate as a Teacher-Trainer, you must fulfill the following requirements:

- 1. Read *Understanding World Religions* and *Understanding Sectarian Groups in America*, and write about your choice of religion. Areas of specialty may include:
 - o Hinduism (may also include Transcendental Meditation and Hare Krishna)
 - o Buddhism (may also include Zen and Nichiren Shosu of America)
 - o Judaism (Orthodox, Conservative, or Reformed)
 - o Islam (may also include Sufism, Nation of Islam, and Baha'ism)
 - o The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints (Mormonism)
 - o Jehovah's Witnesses
 - o Combinations of New Age, Christian Science, Unity, Unitarian-Universalism, Secularism, Atheism, Unification Church, Scientology, and Post-Modernism.
- 2. Visit the religious community of your choice and meet the members.
- 3. Teach several sessions in your church.
